## <u>Ministry of National Security reaffirms commitment to strengthening Police-Civilian</u> <u>Partnerships</u>

At the annual Transforming Our Police Service (TOPS) Awards Ceremony held at Cardiff Hotel & Spa earlier today (November 27), the Ministry of National Security reaffirmed its steadfast support for the Police Civilian Oversight Authority (PCOA) and its instrumental role in fostering positive change within the Jamaica Constabulary Force (JCF).

In her address delivered on behalf of Ambassador Alison Stone Roofe, Permanent Secretary in the Ministry of National Security, Senior Policy Director, Renee Steele commended the PCOA for its ongoing efforts to shape a more transparent, professional and accountable police service.



The Senior Policy Director praised the PCOA's success in enhancing community partnerships through initiatives like the TOPS Competition, which recognises police officers who have demonstrated exemplary service and adherence to the highest standards of professionalism.

Since its inception in 2019, the TOPS initiative has become a symbol of the evolving culture within the Jamaica Constabulary Force, fostering collaboration, improving morale, and promoting ethical policing practices. The Ministry emphasised that such efforts are crucial in transforming policing in Jamaica, making it more transparent, accountable and responsive to the needs of the public.

In line with these objectives, Chief Executive Officer of the PCOA, Otarah Byfield Nugent, acknowledged the significant strides made in fostering stronger police-civilian relationships.

"Our officers have demonstrated excellent service to the citizens of Jamaica," she said. "But transformation should not only be a guiding principle for the JCF but for every citizen who wants better," she added.



She further emphasised the importance of sustaining and strengthening the TOPS initiative, stating, "TOPS is all about preserving the heart of the programme and upgrading the soul and depth of the impact."

By focusing on both recognition and continuous improvement, the PCOA aims to deepen its influence on the JCF and the broader community.

The PCOA plays a critical role in ensuring that the voices of citizens are heard and considered in shaping policies and practices.

The Ministry holds an ongoing commitment to the PCOA, noting that the continued success of the police force hinges on strong civilian oversight and active community engagement.

"We will continue to work closely with the PCOA to ensure that the progress we have made in police reform is not only maintained but built upon," Ms. Steele said.

"Together, we will foster a future where every citizen feels safe and valued, and where our police force exemplifies the highest ideals of integrity, professionalism, and service" she stated.
